

It's not just the place for home furnishing shopping. SoCo is also foodie heaven. With a farmers market each Saturday, cookware shop, wine boutique and a host of restaurants, it's a special spot to linger over coffee, lunch or dinner. Here's a list of highlights.

Taco Maria: A critic's favorite, this is no taqueria but a fresh take on authentic Mexican cuisine.

Bistro Papillote: Chef Laurent Brazier treats diners to traditional French dishes such as Croque Monsieur, and he does his own décor, changing the wallpaper and other fixtures regularly.

The Mixing Glass: Mixologist Gabrielle Dion offers classes, stemware and everything for sophisticated cocktails including hard-to-find cordials and spirits. Absinthe, anyone?

Savory Spice Shop: Barbecue rubs, exotic dried

## Dynamic destination

n the aftermath of the Great Recession, the grouping of home decor stores just off the 405 in Costa Mesa was a somewhat empty, not entirely welcoming space called the South Coast Home Furnishings Center.

"It was not a place that you would have wanted to spend time," said Scott Burnham of Burnham Ward Properties. It lacked life, and customers.

In 2009, Burnham and Byron Ward bought the struggling center, completed only two years earlier, out of foreclosure. They set about transforming it with a new vision.

"We recognized that it was a location that we had to create as a destination. It had to be a place that you wanted to go," Burnham said.

Seven years later, South Coast Collection is a mix of big home design stores, independent clothing boutiques, and restaurants that are some of the best in Southern California.


"It has now become part of people's daily ritual, whether they're having a cup of coffee at Portola Coffee Lab or lunch at Greenleaf and shopping in between," Burnham said.

That transformation created a social atmosphere, he said.

That meant rethinking the mix of stores and restaurants and adding communal areas and more attractive landscaping. In other words, inventing a place that encouraged more hanging out.

"We recognized that if we really wanted to pursue our vision, we were going to have to start from scratch," Burnham said. To attract the right tenants, they redesigned the entire place, removing stone from walls, replacing roofs, remaking landscapes and adding communal areas where shoppers would be enticed to linger. They replaced low ceilings and fluorescent lighting with open ceilings and softer, halogen lighting.

With some of the tenants brought in by Burnham Ward, the move to South Coast Collection was a major step. Surfas, the professional kitchen-supply store that's also open to the home cook, had had just one location since its founding in 1937 - until it opened in South Coast Collection. Pirch opened its interactive kitchen and bath design store at SoCo as a concept store. Now Pirch has re-created that model in other locations around the country, Burnham said.



Those big decor stores such as Design Within Reach, HD Buttercup and Cisco Home are complemented by the OC Mix. In creating that space, the developers took a cue from marketplace-food halls like the San Francisco Ferry Building and Brentwood Country Mart in Santa Monica. They turned what was one store into boutiques and restaurants interspersed with places to gather and pleasant outdoor walkways. Now shoppers meet friends, surf the web at common tables, or dine al fresco on the patio at Pueblo restaurant.

Unlike the early days, when Burnham and Ward were trying to court new tenants, sometimes with not much more than concept renderings, South Coast Collection is a coveted destination, Burnham said.

Home furnishings store Room & Board is set to move in soon, along with lighting fixtures company Lightopia. Furniture store Robert Westley will double in size, and Italian furniture store Calligaris recently opened [See story, Page 8].

"We've refined it over the years," Burnham said.

"It just becomes better and better."
